<p>Parent Survey Core Training for FRS or FAWs Developed by Great Kids, Inc., FRS core training is designed for those who will fill the role of Family Resource Specialist/Family Assessment Worker and their supervisors. Trainees learn how to incorporate a strength-based, relationship-focused assessment process into their work using the Kempe Family Stress Checklist (Parent Survey). The focus is on promoting the assessment process as a unique service rather than as simply an eligibility tool. Each person has opportunity to practice a parent survey and will be asked to send 2 completed parent surveys to the trainer for review following training. This training is appropriate for all staff who supervises employees who work with children and families- Not for direct service staff. This is now a 2 day training.
