<b>HB 1207 – Heretick</b>	Allows those who are the subject of a complaint re: child abuse/neglect to be provided unredacted copies of notes and reports relating to the report and the reporter and collateral witnesses, and other information that DSS will use to make a determination about a CAN report. DSS may only keep the name of the reporter and other witnesses confidential if they believe it will endanger the well-being of the child or the life or safety of the witness.
